Selected Oregon 2009 Session Bills for Matrix

- #1 **SB76** **Klamath River Dams**—Requires PP & L to remove electric generating dams on the Klamath River. The costs to be passed on to PP & L customers. Furthermore, it will increase power rates because hydro power is very cost effective.
- #2 **SB338** **Authorizing Bonds for Public Works Projects**—Authorizes long term bonds (15 years?) to do maintenance on institutions of higher learning and state agencies! It appears approximately half of it is within Senate President Peter Courtney's district.
- #3 **SB519** **Mandatory Workplace Meetings**—Prohibits employers from penalizing employees for not attending employer-organized meetings about the employer's opinions on religions or politics.
More regulations!
- #4 **HB2001** **Transit and Gas Tax Increase**—Authorizes bonds for development of air, rail, public transit, highway and marine transportation. To include footpaths and bike trails. Costs to be covered by an increase of 6 cents per gallon of gasoline and increases of title fees of \$22 and vehicle registration by \$16. You can imagine how much actual road building will take place when the State's blatant policy has been **NO NEW ROADS!**
- #5 **HB2005** **Petition Regulation Amendments**—Significantly increases costs and restrictions related to obtaining signatures of electors on a state initiative, referendum, recall petition or prospective petition.
- #6 **HB2067** **Expiration Dates For Tax Credits**—Establishes a variety of expiration dates for a wide variety of tax credits. That is, a tax increase!
- #7 **HB2116** **Changing Health Care Assessment**—Establishes Health Care for All Oregon Children. Funds to come from 1% of gross amount of medical insurance and from hospitals receiving Medicare money.
- #8 **HB2157** **Severing the Federal and State Income Tax Connection**—While the authors of this bill proclaim it will have minimal financial effect, the heavy minority report at least in part was because it denies Oregon companies the federal incentives to purchase equipment for manufacturing operations. **(Fewer jobs!)**
- #9 **HB2186** **Greenhouse Gas Emissions**—Authorizes the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by vehicles – all on the false premise that CO2 has more than a miniscule effect on earth's temperature.
- #10 **HB2472** **Renewable Energy Tax Credits Amendments**—Affects business tax credits for facilities that produce renewable energy or manufacture its equipment, including electric vehicles. More regulations – all based on the false premise that CO2 has more than a miniscule effect on earth's temperature.
- #11 **HB2649** **Income Tax Increase**—Increases income tax retroactively to January 1, 2009. Increases effects incomes of \$125,000 or more per year – the very people that invest to create jobs.
- #12 **HB2726** **Nutrition Labeling on Menus**—Requires chain restaurants to show nutritional information on menus, subject to evaluation by the DHS. **More costs, bureaucracy and regulations!**
- #13 **HB3300** **Promoting Green Jobs**—Requires the Economic and Community Development Department to promote green industries. If these jobs made economic sense, private capital would have created them.
- #14 **HB3405** **Corporate Tax Increase**—Incredibly, this corporate tax is retroactive to January 1, 2009. Also, it impacts gross revenues – even if there is no profit. Because of its magnitude, it will many eliminate thousands of jobs in the private sector. Also, corporations have to pass on the tax increase to the consumers. Oregon voters rejected a sales tax nine times. Isn't this a well disguised sales tax?
